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

Why a Port

- Not every one runs Linux
- Gives idea about quality of code
- Personal curiosity
 - and I don't do Linux



Methodology

- Just give it a try, but keep track of problems
 - Notes in a file
- Keep changes under RCS
 - in case one forget to make notes
 - might be a start of a FreeBSD port/package
 - slightly over the top
- Build it on my personal workstation
 - FreeBSD 7.1



Things I was missing

- PostGress Database
- Lots of python related stuff
 - mod-python
 - Apache was broken
- Some Corba related stuff
 - Why a dependency on documents?
- Eppd required weird stuff
 - apx flags differs
 - Silly strnlen call needed to be implemented



Things I was missing (2)

- Lots of python related stuff
 - py-simpletal
 - py-imaging
 - mod-python
 - Apache was broken, needs reinstall



Testing the parts

- Fred manager starts the FRED as a test
 - Lots of trivial stuff
- Thumbs up for having this
 - Too bad I ran out of time
 - Tempting to make changes ...



Findings

- Add-on software under FreeBSD in /usr/local, Linux in /usr
 - Has consequences for path names
 - /bin/bash versus /usr/local/bash
 - /bin/true versus /usr/bin/true
 - throwing in symbolic links was tempting but sym links are evil!
 - small linux utilities missing:
 - pidof is a pain, better design would eliminate the problem



Conclusions

- FRED seems pretty clean
- Small improvements desired for easy operation
- No idea how easy to adapt policy decisions
- Nevertheless promising!
